Care for Creation Tip: Most communities have a Christmas tree recycle program. They pick up your tree at curb side at certain times in early January. But here are some other ideas... Take your tree to your backyard. It works as a great hiding place for birds, small animals, and outdoor creatures that are good for your garden. Add stringed popcorn and pine cones covered in peanut butter and bird seed and you feed those creatures and encourage them to stay in your garden. In the spring you can use the needles as mulch and garden paths and chop the branches for more mulch and boarders.
