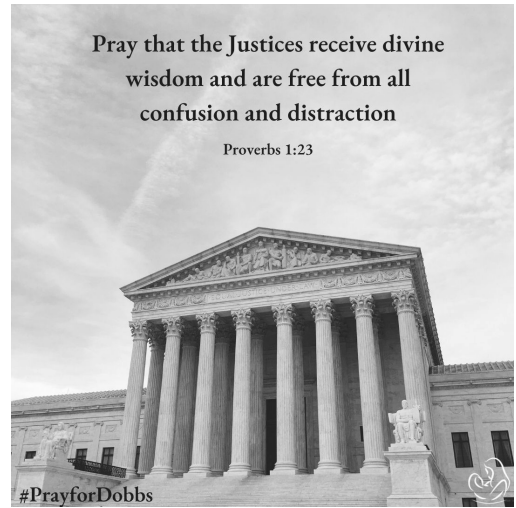

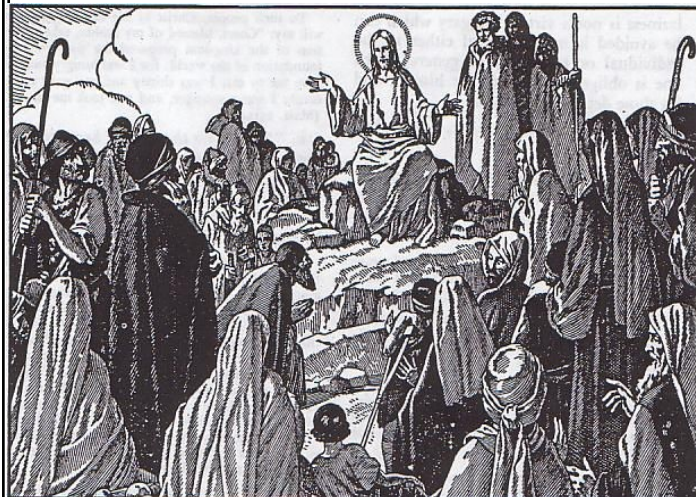

As we listen to this Gospel, the Beatitudes jar our sensibilities. Those who are poor, hungry, weeping, or persecuted are called blessed. This is indeed a Gospel of reversals. Those often thought to have been forgotten by God are called blessed. In the list of woes, those whom we might ordinarily describe as blessed by God are warned about their peril. Riches, possessions, laughter, reputation...these are not things that we can depend upon as sources of eternal happiness. The ultimate peril is in misidentifying the source of our eternal happiness. The beatitudes are often described as a framework for Christian living. Our vocations as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. We are challenged to examine our present situation in the context of our ultimate horizon, the Kingdom of God.
