### MASS INTENTIONS

It has been a long-standing tradition of the Church to accept requests for your intentions of the living or deceased at regularly scheduled Masses in return for a \$5 offering called a stipend. Now that we have a regular schedule of weekday and Sunday Masses again, our calendar is open to receive any intentions that you might wish to request. Our openings at this time are for Sunday, Tuesday or Wednesday Masses. On Sunday one of the Masses must be offered for the People of the Parish so only one request can be honored that day.

### ASH WEDNESDAY—THIS WEEK—FEB. 10

Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season during which the Lord summons us to repentance. As we pray together we will hear God's invitation to reform our lives, and we will mark our foreheads with the sign of our salvation using ashes burnt from last Palm Sunday's branches.

### **Questions and Answers about Lenten Practices**

#### **Who should fast?**

Catholics ages 18 to 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting on these days means we can have only one full meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular meal times if necessary, but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals.

#### **Are there exemptions other than age from the requirement to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday?**

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

#### **All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.**

On the Fridays of Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence and prayer.
