# Statue of St. Thérèse of Lisieux

The statue of St. Thérèse is located on the right side altar. St. Thérèse was born in Lisieux, France on January 2, 1873 and she died from tuberculosis on September 30, 1897. Her feast day is on October 1<sup>st</sup>. St. Thérèse was a Carmelite sister who entered the Carmel at the age of 15 in the year 1888. St. Thérèse had a great love for God and showed us the "little way." The "little way" is doing



small things with great love for our Lord. St. Thérèse said that the little way is the surest way to God. She described it as like taking an elevator to Himself. St. Thérèse wanted to pray for others and love others in her "little way" that she said "when I die, I will send down a shower of roses from the heavens. I will spend my heaven by doing good on earth." On the evening of the death of St. Thérèse, she was very ill and she suddenly sat up, and had a gaze that the other sisters would never forget and she spoke her last words. "Oh, how I love You!...My God...How I love You!

Novena Prayer to St. Thérèse: Saint Therese, the Little Flower of Jesus, please pick a rose from the heavenly garden, and send it to me with a message of love. I ask you to obtain for me the favors that I seek (here mention your request). Recommend my request to Mary, Queen of Heaven, so that she may intercede for me, with you, before her Son, Jesus Christ. ## LATIN MASS AT ST. PAT'S

The Parish Council has requested a Latin Mass here at St. Patrick Church. On **March 5**<sup>th</sup>, we will be celebrating a Low Mass. This is possibly the first Latin Mass celebrated at St. Patrick since the 1960's! A couple Q&A's:

Will you know what's going on? Yes! The Latin Mass follows the same basic structure as the English Mass (Greeting, Penitential, Opening Prayer, Readings, (opt. homily), preparation of the altar, Eucharistic Prayer, Communion, and the Closing Prayer). There are additional prayers at the beginning (Prayers at the Foot of the Altar) and at the End (an extra Gospel reading and the Leonine Prayers).

What about the Latin? There will be books available with side-by-side Latin and English. You can read along in English if you so choose. The readings will be in Latin and then in English.

**Isn't Latin moving us backwards?** No-Latin Masses across the country are filled with young people and families. The younger generation craves the tradition and beauty of the Latin Mass. In a secular world, the Latin Mass fills a void in peoples' hearts. Latin Masses are growing quickly.

Why would someone want to go to a Latin Mass? To experience the Mass that was passed on by our ancestors. This is the Mass that most of our favorite saints experienced. Connect to our Catholic heritage!

The Low Mass allows for a different type of prayer. There is more silence and time to reflect on the sacrifice of the Mass. Many people love the silence instantly, while others appreciate it more and more as they go to the Latin Mass more often.
