DID YOU KNOW YOU CAN DONATE TO THE CHURCH USING MONEY FROM AN IRA?

Money from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) can be donated to the church. What's more, if you've reached the age where you need to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) from your traditional IRAs, you can avoid paying taxes on the money by donating it to the church.

This tax break was made permanent in 2015. You just have to be sure to follow the rules carefully.

HOW A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD) WORKS

A distribution from a traditional IRA normally incurs taxes since the account holder didn't pay taxes on the money when the money was paid in. But account holders, aged 70½ or older who make a contribution directly from a traditional IRA to a qualified charity, can donate up to \$100,000.00 without it being considered a taxable distribution. The deduction effectively lowers the donor's adjusted gross income (AGI).
