# St. Patrick

The statue of St. Patrick is located on the far right of the high altar. St. Patrick was born in Kilpatrick, Scotland in the year 387. When St. Patrick was 16 he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and was sold into slavery and tended the flocks of his master for six years. While St.



Patrick was in Ireland he was able to learn the Celtic language and became familiar with the pagan religion, Druidism. After St. Patrick's six years of enslavement he was able to escape his master and had to travel 200 miles back home. When St. Patrick returned home his heart was set on devoting himself to the service of God. St. Patrick later returned to Ireland, as a bishop, to spread the Gospel. St. Patrick is known for converting all of Ireland. He is also known for using shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity to the people of Ireland and for driving the snakes out of Ireland. While snakes are not native to Ireland and still do not live in Ireland today, the snakes are representative of the Druids that were in Ireland. St. Patrick died on March 17, 461 after having many churches built throughout Ireland. St. Patrick has a famous poem about his faith and trust in God, "Christ be within me. Christ behind me. Christ before me. Christ beside me. Christ to win me. Christ to comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ inquired, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger." St. Patrick's feast day is March 17<sup>th</sup>.
