#### **OVERVIEW OF RCIA**

## Rite of Acceptance/ Rite of Welcoming

When an inquirer is prepared to move forward on the journey, understanding the basics of Christian teaching and showing the beginnings of spiritual life, he or she will publicly declare his or her desire share in the "life and hope in Christ" at the Rite of Acceptance. The Church, through the local community, affirms this desire by accepting inquirers into the Order of Catechumens.

For those who are already baptized, it is at this time that the inquirers are welcomed into the life of the community and acknowledged as part of it, though not yet fully initiated. This is known as the Rite of Welcoming.

## **Catechumenate**

At this point, the unbaptized (catechumens) and baptized (candidates) will spend time learning about the beliefs of Catholics and being introduced to the Catholic way of life. The Scriptures and Catholic teachings will guide their study, while participating in various forms of worship, prayer and parish activities. Individuals will learn what it means to be Catholic and identify what changes may need to be made in their lives. As a time of conversion and deepening faith and commitment to the Church, this period is usually extended, typically lasting a year or more.

During this period, priests, catechists and the RCIA team guide catechumens and candidates in learning the teachings of the Church and in understanding the mystery of salvation. Individual support is provided by a sponsor, and the parish community welcomes and prays for the candidates and catechumens as they are formed in the Catholic way of life.

# **Mass Intentions**

What are they? Each time a priest celebrates Mass, he offers the celebration for a specific person or intention. The intention of the Mass (whether it be a person, group, or situation) receives special graces from God. Much like how we ask friends or family to intercede for us in their personal prayers, having a Mass said for a specific person or intention is like asking the entire Church to intercede for us!

Who can request intentions? You can! It is important for the parish to know that any of us are able to request a Mass be said for a specific person or intention. Most intentions requested are for the repose of the soul of a loved one, but can also be for those living, celebration of an anniversary or other special day, or even groups of people.

How do I get my intentions scheduled? Stop by the office or drop a Mass Intention Request slip in the offertory! To have a Mass said for a specific person or intention, the parish asks for a \$5 donation per Mass. If you wish to donate more than \$5 per Mass, that is okay, but please specify if any of your offering is an extra donation. Feel free to *request* specific dates/days, but know that not all days or specific dates are available or guaranteed until the office can check that specific Mass to see if it has already been requested. If you do not need a specific date, then your intention will be scheduled much faster, as we always have weekday Masses open. If you don't have a preference of dates, or would like to have several Masses said and only pay once, that is okay too! We keep a running list of Masses requested that need to be scheduled, and can let you know when your request comes up and for which Mass we have it scheduled.

Why are Mass intentions so important? You know that Pope Paul VI once said, "The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!"? The reason is so perfect is because it is Christ's own prayer! Jesus offers himself every day on our altars. His offering is perfect adoration of God; perfect thanksgiving; perfect atonement for our sins; and perfect in power to obtain for us and for others every grace of which we stand in need. Having a Mass said is such a great way to apply the power and miracles associated with the celebration of the Eucharist to your specific intention!
