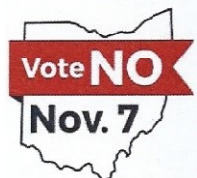

LOGAN COUNTY PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

Parish Council met Tuesday, September 19th at 7:00 p.m. in the St. Joseph Room at St. Mary of the Woods with 8 of the 12 members present. Fr. Shawn led us in opening prayer and there were no parishioners present to address the council.

PPC and Fr. Shawn continued the discussion about consolidating the two Logan County Parish offices into one. This will significantly reduce Father's travel time and having all the staff in one location will reduce the amount of time required to manage the churches. Less driving, and less time in the office will allow Fr. Shawn more time to administer to the parishioners of St. Mary's and St. Pat's. More discussion will follow.

The Parish Council continues to work on the Family Vision Statements and action plans for the four Beacons of Light Visioning Tools (Evangelization Principle, Love in Action Principle, Church Principle, and Eucharist Principle). Fr. Shawn and others will be meeting in Dayton on September 27th with representatives from other Families of Parishes to discuss progress and compare notes.

SMOW - Plans are moving forward to replace the glass in the ceiling fixtures in the center of the Church. The new glass will be frosted and will hide the bulbs better.

St. Pat's - The acoustic tiles are completed in Makley Hall, and several options were reviewed to build a restroom in the back of Church.

Father gave us his blessing and the meeting concluded at 8:37 p.m.

Protect Ohio Women, Families, and Children

On November 7, 2023, Ohioans will vote on a proposed, dangerous amendment (deceptively named “The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety”) to the Ohio Constitution that would remove virtually ALL restrictions on abortion.



If enacted, this amendment would revise the Constitution of Ohio to effectively:

- ***Put women at risk.*** This amendment would enable elimination of some of the most basic, fundamental safety regulations on abortion clinics, including the current requirement for an abortion to be performed by a licensed physician.
- ***Threaten parental rights.*** The vague language in the amendment opens the door to anyone under 18 having an abortion, or even beginning cross-sex hormone treatment, without parental consent or notification.
- ***Allow abortion through 9 months of pregnancy.*** The amendment provides caveats such that a healthy, fully-formed infant in the womb who otherwise could be delivered with no issues would still be a candidate for a surgical dismemberment abortion.
