**FROM THE DESK OF FATHER SHAWN...**

St. Michael Prayer

*At the September Parish Council meeting, a parishioner requested that we say the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel at the end of our Masses. The request received unanimous support from the council members at the meeting. We have a stained glass window on the west side of the Church that depicts St. Michael, so I think it is fitting that we pray for his intercession.*

*On October 13, 1884, Pope Leo XIII had a vision as he celebrated Mass in his private chapel. He stood motionless for 10 minutes. By one account, he overheard a conversation between Jesus and Satan. Satan asked for one century in all of human history to have greater power to carry out his evil work, and ultimately to destroy the Church. He chose the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Immediately after Mass, Pope Leo XIII composed the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel to defend the faithful from the power of Satan and his kingdom.*

*The Prayer to St. Michael was recited at the end of Masses throughout the world from that time until 1970. Most parishes stopped praying the prayer with the liturgical changes that year. Pope John Paul II in 1994 urged Catholics to pray that prayer again. As we see the power of evil at work inside the Church and throughout the world, it seems fitting that we turn to the powerful intercession of Saint Michael to protect our Church, our families, and our world.*
