**ALL SAINTS DAY**

The beginning of November provides two very important days on which the Church celebrates the distinct modes of existence within the Communion of Saints. All of us--the Church on earth, the Church in Purgatory, and the Church in Heaven--are united in the love that comes from Christ our King, and are called respond to each other from that same love, as a source.

We on earth, engaged in the midst of spiritual battle for the salvation of our own soul and the souls of others, are the Church Militant. As individuals, our destiny is not yet decided; we may still choose to accept or to refuse Our Lord's offer of grace. We need help--and so the Church Triumphant (in Heaven) and the Church Suffering (in Purgatory) come to our aid with their prayers and concern, so that we remain united to the Heart of Christ.

The Church Suffering consists of the Holy Souls in Purgatory. It is for these souls that the Church celebrates All Souls Day (November 2). The Holy Souls have both more joy, and more sorrow, than we can have on this earth; more sorrow because they repent more deeply of their sins, of which they are being purified, and more joy because they know without a doubt that they will reach Paradise. Purgatory is only for a time; only Heaven and Hell are eternal. The Holy Souls are completely dependent on the prayers of the Church in Heaven and the Church on earth in order to speed them on their way. For this reason, the Church prescribes that we offer for the Holy Souls the Sacrifice of the Mass. There is no more powerful prayer on earth than the Mass, because it is Jesus' own prayer, and His self-offering to the Father.

The Church Triumphant is the entire population of Heaven, which we celebrate on All Saints Day (November 1). Everyone in Heaven is a saint--even if a relative few are canonized. On All Saints Day, we remember all those who have entered into eternal glory. Whereas the Church Militant and the Church Suffering stand in a particular position of need, the Church Triumphant needs nothing; they spend all their love on God above all, and on us for love of Him. This day reminds us that the only fulfillment for the longing of our hearts is found in the Presence of God.

While we cannot yet dwell in His Presence in eternity, we can spend some time in it on earth; and so, All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, on which we are called to come to Mass to join in the worship of the Church Triumphant in Heaven, to come to the aid of the Church Suffering in Purgatory, and to strengthen ourselves for our campaign as the Church Militant on earth.
