Celebrate Recovery

Christ-based 12-step program offers relief from life’s hurts and hang-ups. Celebrate Recovery meets every Friday, 7 p.m. at Union Station, 613 Hamilton St.

A group of local churches have come together to bring a nationally respected resource to Logan County’s fight against substance abuse and other negative behaviors.

The initial concerns were on the opiate problem in Logan County and the deaths attributed to that, however, there are many other hurts, habits and hang-ups that are causing great harm to people in Logan County and that through Christ we can help.

STAINED GLASS UPDATE

As I mentioned previously at Mass, our stained glass windows are in need of a full restoration. The lead in the windows lasts 80-100 years before it begins to weaken with age, which causes damage to the glass panes. We have signed a contract with Blanck Studios from Ixonia, WI. They have done excellent work at St. Boniface in Piqua, Holy Angels in Sidney, and St. Joseph in Wapakoneta.

The total cost of this restoration will be well over \$100,00. If you would like to support this project, you can specify on the memo line of a check 'Stained Glass' or you can donate to the monthly improvement fund. Our stained glass windows are an important piece of our history at St. Patrick; thank you for your generosity in preserving our stained glass!

We will also be installing new storm windows to protect the stained glass. Our current storm windows are not vented, so heat can build up inside the storm windows and damage the glass. The new storm windows will be vented, and they will be aesthetically much nicer than our current windows.
