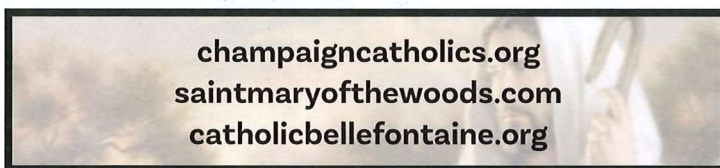

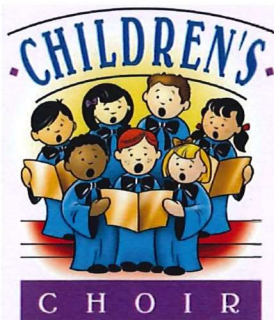

CONSECRATED VIRGINITY

The life of a consecrated virgin may seem unremarkable at first glance, as she works a job and lives in the secular world. Interiorly, however, her life is set apart for Jesus Christ. Every day, every moment, of the life of a consecrated virgin is dedicated to her divine Spouse and lived as a magnificent image of His spousal relationship with the Church. Even more deeply than the dedicated love of a married couple, a consecrated virgin is totally dedicated to Jesus, as her Spouse, her Savior, and her God. Similar to a married couple, the special relationship cannot be fully expressed to others so much as lived as a love unique to the lovers. A consecrated virgin becomes a living image of the Church, manifesting the Church's love, obedience, and receptivity to the will of Jesus Christ to the world. In addition to the spiritual graces particular to this vocation, there are several interesting and symbolic endeavors which a consecrated virgin undertakes. In obedience to the Church and to aid her in her vocation, the consecrated virgin keeps in communication with her bishop by whose authority the virgin is admitted to the consecrated state, and if suitable, meets with him annually. The bishop stands both as the representative of the Church and as Christ. He seeks to guide the consecrated virgin as the primary representative of Christ in this regard. The bishop stands as the representative of the Church for and in which the virgin is consecrated, and as the representative of Christ, the virgin's beloved spouse, as the spiritual head of the Church.

The virgin also daily prays the Liturgy of the Hours - the prayer of the Church throughout the day dedicating all time to Christ. This prayer is prayed at different times throughout the day in obedience to the command to "pray always." This is the same Liturgy of the Hours that priests promise to pray and similar to those of various religious orders. The life of prayer and service under the authority of the bishop help to conform a virgin's life more fully to her divine Spouse.

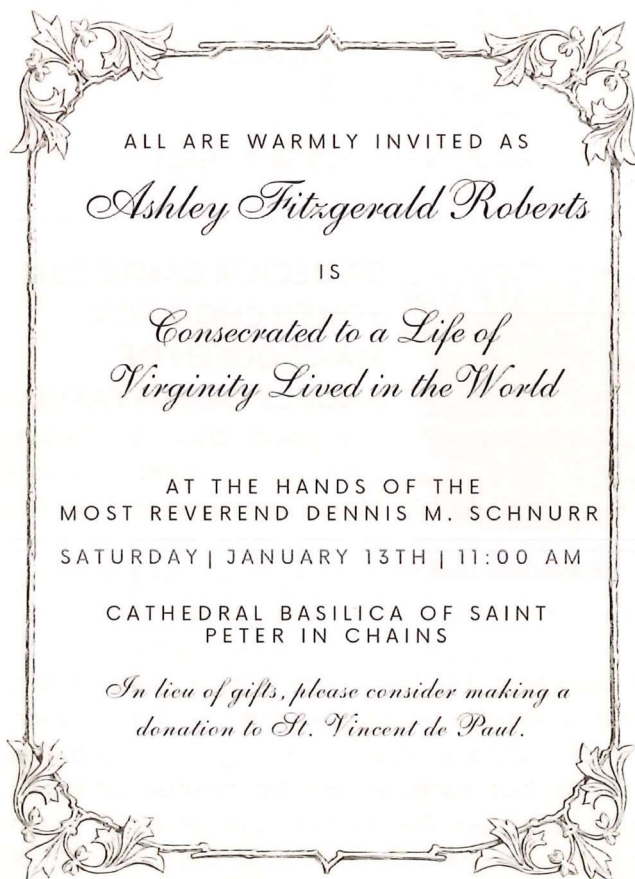


CONSECRATED VIRGINITY
