Second Week of Advent

Stir up our hearts, a Lord, to prepare the paths of Thine Only-begotten Son: that we may worthily serve Thee with hearts purified by His coming: Who livest and reignest with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit. ever one God. world

The word Advent is from the Latin adventus for "coming" and is associated with the four weeks of preparation for Christmas. Advent al-



ways contains four Sundays, beginning on the Sunday nearest the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, (November 30) and continuing until December 24. It blends together a penitential spirit, very similar to Lent, a liturgical theme of preparation for the Second and Final Coming of the Lord, called the Parousia, and a joyful theme of getting ready for the Bethlehem event.

Since the 900s Advent has been considered the beginning of the Church year. This does not mean that Advent is the most important time of the year. Easter has always had this honor.

The traditional color of Advent is purple or violet which symbolizes the penitential spirit. Religious traditions associated with Advent express all these themes.



New Developments in the Music Department!

Our music program is branching out in new (and old) territory! Throughout Advent, they will be chanting the 'Communion Antiphon' in place of one of the hymns. The Church gives us three antiphons, usually lines from Scripture, that can be chanted at each Mass. There is an entrance antiphon, offertory antiphon, and communion antiphon. By chanting these antiphons, it not only adds beauty to the Mass, but it also enables the faithful to reflect more deeply on those lines of Scripture. Chant is a powerful way for us to honor the Word of God given to us in Scripture.

Vatican II's *Instruction on Music in the Liturgy* teaches us the important role of chant within the Mass. It says, "Gregorian chant, as proper to the Roman liturgy, should be given pride of place" (50a). Despite this instruction, chant has fallen out of practice in many Catholic parishes in the United States. The Archdiocese is working to revive this beautiful element of our Catholic tradition.

Thanks to all those in our music program for making this happen! I hope these chants will enable us all to enter more deeply into the Word of God this Advent!
