Third Week of Advent

GIVE THEM A DAY

The tradition of having a nativity scene or "crèche" was made popular by St. Francis of Assisi. It is a reproduction of the cave in Bethlehem with Mary, Joseph, the infant Jesus in a manger, shepherds, angels, and animals. Each night during Advent, children are encouraged to place in the manger one piece of straw for each good deed done that day by a family member. This Advent tradition combines the spirit of conversion and the coming of Jesus. There is a blessing ceremony provided by the Church in the Book of Blessings for the crèche.

New Developments in the Music Department!

Our music program is branching out in new (and old) territory! Throughout Advent, they will be chanting the 'Communion Antiphon' in place of one of the hymns. The Church gives us three antiphons, usually lines from Scripture, that can be chanted at each Mass. There is an entrance antiphon, offertory antiphon, and communion antiphon. By chanting these antiphons, it not only adds beauty to the Mass, but it also enables the faithful to reflect more deeply on those lines of Scripture. Chant is a powerful way for us to honor the Word of God given to us in Scripture.

Vatican II's *Instruction on Music in the Liturgy* teaches us the important role of chant within the Mass. It says, "Gregorian chant, as proper to the Roman liturgy, should be given pride of place" (50a). Despite this instruction, chant has fallen out of practice in many Catholic parishes in the United States. The Archdiocese is working to revive this beautiful element of our Catholic tradition.

Thanks to all those in our music program for making this happen! I hope these chants will enable us all to enter more deeply into the Word of God this Advent!

WANT TO BE CATHOLIC: If you are an adult (over the age of 7) and are already baptized in another Christian tradition the process for "Full Communion" with the Catholic Church is as simple as contacting the Office for an appointment with the Fr. Shawn Landenwitch. In the event you are not Baptized, the process for becoming Catholic is called the RCIA or the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults that requires a more indepth preparation and period of study.
