Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary

What is Marian Consecration?

A deepening of our devotion to Our Lady, through which we give ourselves to her in a special way (make a consecration), so that she can accomplish her God-given task of bringing us closer to her Son.

How does it work?

 We'll spend 33 days preparing, using Fr. Michael Gaitley's "33 Days to Morning Glory". Every day, we'll have a short reading that helps us understand the Marian teachings of four great saints; St. Louis de Montfort, St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and Pope St. John Paul II.

We'll also meet weekly to support one another and look more closely at what these Marian saints teach us. Whole families are welcome. We'll discuss the readings, pray the Rosary together, and have some time for fellowship.

- Then, we'll make our consecration together at the Fatima Mass on Sunday, May 16--the same day that Father will consecrate our parishes to Mary, as well!
 - Books will be provided, free of charge.
