SACRED TRIDUUM

“The Paschal Triduum (the “three Days) is the heart of our liturgical year and celebrates the heart of our faith, the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ: his life, Passion, death, and Resurrection. One long feat, it goes from sundown to sundown, beginning with the evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper, through Good Friday, reaching its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closing with Evening Prayer of Easter Sunday.

Holy Thursday—7:00 PM

On the first evening of the Triduum we commemorate the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood and Christ’s command of service and charity when he washed the feet of his disciples. One special ceremony is that we receive the holy oils that will be used to anoint the sick, the catechumens, the newly baptized and those to be confirmed. They will be blessed by the archbishop at the Chrism Mass on Tuesday at the Cathedral.

After Holy Communion the Eucharist for Good Friday will be transferred in a simple procession to Makley Hall. All are urged to spend some time in private prayer there. Remember the words of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane: “Could you not watch one hour with me?” The evening will close at 10:00 PM with the Night Prayer of the Church.

Good Friday—12:10 PM

The principal liturgy at 12:10 PM commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and his total self giving to God. By this saving act we are saved, redeemed from our sins and failures. And that is why we can call this day “Good.” In light of this, we show reverence and honor to the cross, the instrument

cross, the instrument through which our salvation has been won and we are invited to show a special sign of veneration after the cross is carried into the assembly. This occurs after the Scripture readings which include the Passion account according to St. John, and the solemn general intercessions for the needs of the Church and the world. The liturgy concludes with the distribution of Holy Communion that was consecrated at the Holy Thursday Mass.

The collection this day supports the Franciscan Friars and others so they may continue caring for Christianity’s holiest sites and for God’s people in the Holy Land. The daily news reminds us of the violence and instability plaguing the Middle East, but we rarely hear of the shrinking Christian community there, a community that struggles to remain in the land of Christ’s birth, death and resurrection.



Easter Vigil—9:00 PM

We initiate our elect catechumens and candidates for full communion who have been formed in the faith together for many months. We will assemble outdoors around the Easter Fire. Led by the Easter Candle symbolizing Christ, we process into church where the Pascal Candle and our individual candles will be lit; we listen to our sacred stories, initiate our catechumens and candidates and celebrate Eucharist. This is the most sacred night of the year celebrating the very foundation of our faith, Jesus’ resurrection. There should be nothing more important to do than be there.
