

ASK FATHER SHAWN

Q: If the Eucharist is meant to give us eternal life, why can't you take it if you are not in a state of grace when that would seem to be when you need it most?

A: The Sacrament of Confession is the remedy the Lord gives to His Church for mortal sin. A person in a state of mortal sin should repent of the sin and be reconciled to God in the Sacrament of Confession before receiving Communion.

The gift of the Eucharist does not forgive mortal sin; the Eucharist is meant to bring about an intimate sharing in the life of Jesus Christ for those who are already in a state of grace (friendship with God). The unbaptized must be baptized before receiving Communion. Mortal sin (mentioned in 1 John 5:16-17) causes a person to lose the life of grace first received in Baptism. Those in mortal sin are not in a state of friendship with God and, therefore, cannot enter into Communion with Jesus Christ through reception of Communion. In fact, a person would be desecrating the Eucharist by receiving Our Lord unworthily. That is why Saint Paul says in 1 Cor 11:29 that those who receive the Eucharist unworthily are eating and drinking judgment upon themselves.

Unfortunately, when people disregard the requirements for proper reception of Communion, it causes great spiritual harm. For example, it can weaken one's faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. As we celebrate the Eucharistic Revival across our county, we should all respect the greatest gift Jesus gave to His Church by receiving the Eucharist with great love and only when we are properly disposed.




MARY, QUEEN OF ANGELS FAMILY OF PARISHES PICNIC

NEXT SUNDAY, AUGUST 6TH, IS THE FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The Feast commemorates one of the pinnacles of Jesus' earthly life, when He revealed His divinity to three of His closest disciples by means of a miraculous and supernatural light.

Before His triumphal entry into Jerusalem, Christ climbed to a high point on Mount Tabor with His disciples, Peter, James and John. While Jesus prayed upon the mountain, His appearance was changed by a brilliant white light which shone from Him and from His clothing.

During this event, the Old Testament figures of Moses and the prophet Elijah also appeared, and spoke of how Christ would suffer and die after entering Jerusalem, before His Resurrection.

Matthew, Mark, and Luke all record that the voice of God was heard, confirming Jesus as His Son (Matthew 17:5, Mark 9:6, Luke 9:35). Peter and John make specific reference to the event in their writings, as confirming Jesus' divinity and His status as the Messiah (2 Peter 1:17, John 1:14).

"After six days, Jesus took Peter, James, and John, His brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, 'Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.'" – Matthew 17:1-5
