AS WE BEGIN ADVENT

What is the Advent season?

Advent Season is a very special time of year that sometimes gets lost in the bright lights of the Christmas season it precedes. The first day of Advent is the first day of a new Liturgical (or church) calendar and begins a four week period of preparation in anticipation of the nativity of Jesus at Christmas.In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the readings of Mass on the Sundays of Advent have distinct themes:

On the First Sunday (<u>Advent Sunday</u>), they look forward to the <u>Second Coming</u> of Christ.

On the Second Sunday, the Gospel reading recalls the preaching of <u>John the Baptist</u>, who came to "prepare the way of the Lord"; the other readings have associated themes.

On the Third Sunday (<u>Gaudete Sunday</u>), the Gospel reading is again about John the Baptist, the other readings about the joy associated with the coming of the Savior.

On the Fourth Sunday, the Gospel reading is about the events involving Mary and Joseph that led directly to the birth of Jesus, while the other readings are related to these. In another tradition:

ADVENT WREATH: You don't want the Advent wreath to become just another tradition you do and don't know why. Use these <u>prayers</u> with your family as you reflect on the Advent Wreath each Sunday. And learn more about these symbols during dinner after you light your candles!

Start with the Advent Wreath Blessing

Dear Jesus, as we light the candle(s) on this Advent wreath, may the light of your presence bring joy to our hearts. Bless our family and our friends, and be with all those who are in need this holiday season. Amen. Week One:

Scripture Reflection: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined." Isaiah 9:2 *pause for reflection

Advent Wreath Prayer: Dear Jesus, you are the hope in our messy world. This Advent, help us slow down, listen to your voice, and focus on what's really important. We place our hope in you as we prepare our hearts to celebrate your birth on Christmas. Amen.

RORATE MASS

Saturday, December 18, at St. Patrick.

A Rorate Mass is an Advent tradition of celebrating Mass in honor of Our Lady entirely by candlelight. As Mass progresses, the first light of dawn appears near the time of the consecration, reminding us that Jesus, come into our midst in the Eucharist, is the light that illumines the darkness of the world.

The first words, in Latin, of the opening antiphon are "Rorate caeli" (hence the title "Rorate Mass), and are based on a verse from the book of Isaiah: "Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior."

We will pray the Rosary at 6:00 AM, and Mass will begin at 6:30.

Following Mass, there will be a carry-in breakfast in Makley Hall.
